Physicians utilize numerous interventional procedures including radio frequency, lysis of adhesions, epidurals, nerve blocks, vertebroplasty/ kyphoplasty and spinal cord stimulation, to treat a wide array of conditions including arthritis, sciatica and spinal stenosis. When indicated they are also able to provide options within the field of minimally invasive spine surgery.
